Hanoi, 2 October 2009 – Otis Elevator Vietnam donated 571 helmets to first grade students and teachers of the Tay Son School Primary School in Hanoi. Otis Elevator gave hundreds of helmets to a kindergarten in Ho Chi Minh City last year, and continues its active participation in promoting road traffic safety in Vietnam once again.

Otis Elevator worked with AIP Foundation to donate the helmets through the foundation's *Helmets for Kids (HFK)* program. The ceremony will allow pupils to demonstrate their road safety knowledge through games and performances. Both AIP Foundation and Otis employees will be in attendance to enjoy the festivities. In addition to the donation of helmets, Otis will send a team to train all teachers and children about elevator and escalator safety.

This donation of helmets proves exceptionally timely, as the Vietnamese government recently passed a new helmet law, making it mandatory for children from age six to put on helmets whenever on a motorbike. This draft decree should be brought before the Prime Minister in October for his signature of approval. Police would fine parents (from 100,000 – 200,000 VND) who are carrying juveniles (age six to 18) without a helmet, or who were wearing a helmet improperly. The new decree emphasizes the importance of high quality helmets to best protect the wearer. Mr. Trinh Duc Minh from the DoET agrees, "Laws are in place but we must educating youth about traffic safety is of the utmost importance, especially at this critical juncture. Programs like *HFK* are examples of how to engage the youth, their parents and their teachers on this important issue."
